WCC Cllr Daniell is still pushing hard for work on speeding reduction and as mentioned previously he is testing with Wixford Bridge to see what affect, if any, it has on speeds which will help the argument for some kind of chicane in or out of the village. Gateways are in progress but I think we will be lucky if they are in before Christmas.

7. Planning

8. Speed Watch Group update

Various options for traffic calming remain under consideration.

9. Village Hall Survey – Cllr Cox

There are a number of concerns regarding the condition of the Village Hall, specifically evidence of dampness on the rear wall and obvious movement of the stonework around the large window in the wall alongside the road. In addition, there are uncertainties regarding the the too fand some external lintels.

To address these issues, it is proposed that we commission a qualified surveyor to inspect the building, prepare a schedule of defects in order of severity and recommend suitable measures to remedy the most serious defects together with budget costs.

Three survey quotations have been obtained as follows;

Simon Wilkinson Surveyors Limited (Building Condition Survey) £750.00 +VAT Allcott Associates (Full Survey) £995.00 +VAT Glyn Jones Surveys Ltd (Structural Appraisal) £600.00 +VAT (Full Survey) £800.00 +VAT

A Full Survey best meets our needs as it covers both structural issues and the internal and external condition of the building.

After much discussion the PC agreed to appoint Glyn Jones Surveys Ltd to conduct the works. (Full Survey) £800.00 +VAT Proposed Cllr Cox Seconded Cllr Finch and agreed.

10. Budget consideration and precept setting - To set the precept for 2023/24 Cllr Flaxman expounded on the proposed budget and clarified the current position in papers submitted in advance of this meeting..

Village maintenance costs were discussed and reserves considered.

For the 2023/24 precept the chairman proposed that the precept be decreased by 10% to £6,750 and identified within that, the sum of £2,000 for a further contribution to the village hall if necessary for further improvement or works further to completion of the survey. Also included is a wage inflation linked increase for the Parish Clerk and additional anticipated extra costs for insurance.

The 10% reduction in the precept from the current year is an acknowledgement of the inflationary pressures on our residents.

The precept was agreed at £ 6750.00. Proposed Cllr Finch Seconded Cllr Lloyd and agreed by those present.
